

## TALK: Tuesday 28th October 2pm at St Matthew's Church R & A Garrett – House Decorators

Emma Ferry makes a welcome return as our speaker. Cousins Rhoda and Agnes Garrett were the first English women to train in an architect's office and subsequently to work professionally as "house decorators". Alongside Agnes's older sisters, the political activist Millicent Garrett Fawcett and the doctor Elizabeth Garrett Anderson, they also took part in the agitation against the Contagious Diseases Acts and were both active Suffragists. This illustrated talk discusses their personal histories, their professional work and the publication of their book, Suggestions for House Decoration (1876).

TALK: Tuesday 11th Nov 2025 14:00-15:30 at St Matthew's Church Talk: World War One Poems & Paintings with Nick Nelson

This literary and visual lecture on the poems and paintings of World War One is set to coincide with Armistice Day. Nick Nelson will explore the rich tapestry of poems and paintings created to capture and commemorate aspects of the First World War between 1914 and 1918. We will take a deep dive into the official war poets Wilfred Owen, Rupert Brooke and Siegfried Sassoon alongside the official war artists John Nash, Paul Nash, Henry Tonks and John Singer Sargent. This will lead to a brief survey of Vorticism and Futurism in art and literature, via such seminal figures as Wyndham Lewis, Christian Nevinson and Filippo Tommaso. Time permitting, we will end with Jeremy Deller's creative event of 1st July 2016 'We're Here Because We're Here' commemorating the 100th anniversary of the first day of the Battle of the Somme, 1916.
